Badger Watch Evening Season FAQ

Q: Do I need to book?

A: YES. Booking is essential. Please call 01206 729678

Q: Can I book via email/online?

A: No, we do need to talk with you directly to process these bookings. Please call us on 01206 729678

Q: What time do we need to be there?

A: As a guide, these events have an arrival time of approx 6.30pm - 7.30pm however this does vary depend on the date booked /sunset times during the Badger Watch Season

Q: How long does the watch last

A: As a guide, approx. 2- 2.5hrs after your arrival time, however this does vary slightly as sometimes the badgers may stay longer or arrive a bit later.

Q: How many people are permitted per watch?

A: Places are strictly limited to 4 adults per watch

Q: Is the hide Easy Access?

A: Yes, but please do advise us of any special requirements at time of booking.

Q: Will there be any Trust personal available during the evening?

A: Yes, our Badger Watch Volunteer will accompany you on the watch.

Q: How long can we stay

A: Our Badger Watch Volunteer will advise you on this depending on the badger movement on the evening

Q: Will we see other wildlife?

A: There is a strong possibility that you will see deer, foxes and you may hear owls too.

Q: Can we take pictures?

A: We are happy for people to take pictures, **but FLASH photography is not permitted.**

Q: Do I need to bring special clothing?

A: Although you are sat in a hide and there are armchairs for your comfort, some evenings can be chilly, so please feel free to bring a blanket to keep the chill off.

Q: Are there any lights on the reserve?

A: There are no lights on the reserve except the MAIN carpark, so we recommend you carry a working torch (essential for walk back)
